

CONSOLING AND STRENGTHENING ADVICE

Today's Gospel

Jesus said to the crowd: "They will seize and persecute you, they will hand you over to the synagogues and to prisons, and they will have you led before kings and governors because of my name. It will lead to your giving testimony. Remember, you are not to prepare your defense beforehand, for I myself shall give you a wisdom in speaking that all your adversaries will be powerless to resist or refute. You will even be handed over by parents, brothers, relatives, and friends, and they will put some of you to death. You will be hated by all because of my name, but not a hair on your head will be destroyed. By your perseverance you will secure your lives."


LUKE 21:12-19

Reflection

The early Christians encountered persecution from the home front ("you will

even be handed over by parents, brother, relatives, and friends"), as well as from the leaders of their synagogue and the Roman state. Through these verses Luke offers consolation and strength as believers face their suffering. Hearers of this gospel would be able to identify concrete examples of the persecution Jesus speaks about. During that time, they are not to be anxious. Not an easy task! Ironically, the experience will "lead them to giving testimony" about their faith life. What's more, they are not to prepare a defense for themselves in advance. (For some of us that would be a huge challenge!) They are told: "I myself shall give you a wisdom in speaking that all your adversaries will be powerless to resist or refute." The Christian community is not to depend on themselves for their defense. Imagine being in that position and literally turning *everything* over to God . . . trusting that God will give whatever is needed whenever it is needed.

The promise that "not even one hair on the disciple's head will be harmed" during persecution may seem strange. Basically it is an image that confirms the ultimate spiritual protection for those Christians facing oppression.
