Today's Gospel

A demoniac who could not speak was brought to Jesus, and when the demon was driven out the mute man spoke. The crowds were amazed and said, "Nothing like this has ever been seen in Israel." But the Pharisees said, "He drives out demons by the prince of demons."

Jesus went around to all the towns and villages, teaching in their synagogues, proclaiming the Gospel of the Kingdom, and curing every disease and illness. At the sight of the crowds, his heart was moved with pity for them because they were troubled and abandoned, like sheep without a shepherd. Then he said to his disciples, "The harvest is abundant, but the laborers are few; so, ask the master of the harvest to send out laborers for his harvest."

MATTHEW 9:32-38

Reflection

This gospel never fails to give me pause because I ask myself ... am I one of the laborers that can be counted upon? How do I make this assessment? Do I dig deep and honestly do my own self-assessment on how I'm doing?

The needs of our world seem infinite. One doesn't have to look too closely to see the amount of need in our families, congregations, and neighborhoods – both local and global neighborhoods.
