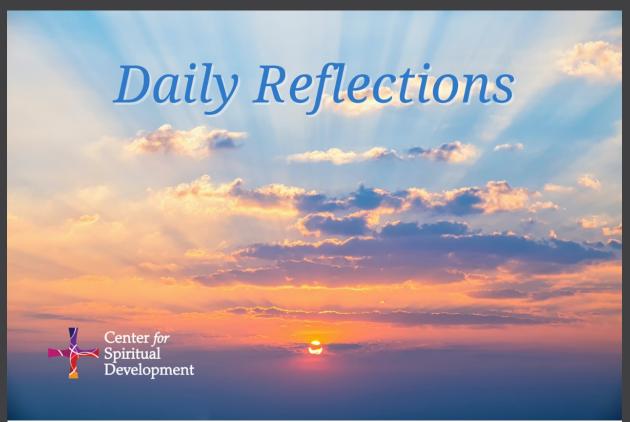




# Reflection

Last month, on August 29, the Memorial of the Passion and Martyrdom of St. John the Baptist, I wrote a reflection based on Mark 6:17-29, "<u>The Oath of a Frightened King</u>." I considered how a weakened king gave in to his wife's demand for the immediate death of John the Baptist, which troubled Herod

because something about this holy man intrigued him, and he liked to listen to him preach.

Today's Gospel, according to Luke, begins with Herod becoming perplexed because he was hearing stories of someone teaching the about the Kingdom of God, curing diseases and sending disciples out to travel from place to place proclaiming the good news. Some people were saying that John the Baptist had been raised from the dead. Herod knew that he had beheaded John; he thought his act of violence had put an end to his troubles...yet he asked, "Who is this about whom I hear such things?" Who is this man Jesus, in homespun clothing, working with his ragtag group of peasant disciples, sending them to teach and heal the sick wherever they go? How does he have such power? Again, Herod was intrigued; he wanted to see Jesus.

What would it be like to walk beside him every day, sharing his dreams and hopes for the world? Is my attraction to Jesus drawing me to follow him and to labor with him in his mission to

heal our suffering world?


