An Excerpt from Today's Gospel

Jesus said to his disciples: "Stay awake! For you do not know on which day your Lord will come. Be sure of this: if the master of the house had known the hour of night when the thief was coming, he would have stayed awake and not let his house be broken into. So too, you also must be prepared, for at an hour you do not expect, the Son of Man will come."

MATTHEW 24:42-44

Reflection

This brief excerpt comes toward the end of Matthew's Gospel, just before Jesus' passion, death and resurrection. Jesus was speaking to the disciples of the *Parousia*, the second coming of Christ as judge at the end of history. This end-time is unknown to everyone; it is a time known only to God. Matthew's Jesus

uses various parables to tell us that we all need to **stay awake** and be watchful, attending to the will of God, because we do not know when Christ, the Lord, will call us home or when the end-time will come. We are invited to be consciously available to God, attentive to the God of surprises who longs to be close to us on our journey toward the fulness of the reign of God. Staying awake means living in constant awareness of God's presence, being thankful for God's closeness and tenderness at every moment of our being in this world.
