Today's First Reading

The LORD God said: "It is not good for the man to be alone. I will make a suitable partner for him." So the LORD God formed out of the ground various wild animals and various birds of the air, and he brought them to the man to see what he would call them; whatever the man called each of them would be its name. The man gave names to all the cattle, all the birds of the air, and all wild animals; but none proved to be the suitable partner for the man. So, the LORD God cast a deep sleep on the man, and while he was asleep, he took out one of his ribs and closed up its place with flesh.

The LORD God then built up into a woman the rib that he had taken from the man. When he brought her to the man, the man said: "This one, at last, is bone of my bones and flesh of my flesh; this one shall be called 'woman,' for out of 'her man' this one has been taken." That is why a man leaves his father and mother and clings to his wife, and the two of them become one flesh.

Harmony

In this reading, we hear of God's creating the creatures of the world, including man and woman. In this well-known passage from Genesis, we hear the words of unity where man and woman become one flesh.

In reflecting on God's creation, there is a sense of harmony in nature. Science has evolved over the centuries, and we've come to realize the interconnectedness of all creation. As human beings, we are a part of this web of creation. The four seasons experienced around the globe, fall, winter, spring, and summer are a unique reminder of God's unfolding revelation.

Today the word we're focusing on is "harvest." Harvest in the literal sense means to gather the crops that were planted in the Spring. We don't have to look far for the deeper spiritual meaning in this word. Fortitude enables us to face adversity, pain, and the struggles that inevitably come our way. It is our perseverance in faith that enables us to persevere. Understanding, piety, and fear of the Lord are the remaining gifts of the Holy Spirit that provide the spiritual strength we need to remain "good and faithful" servants of the Lord. Harmony is a wonderful attribute to nurture in ourselves and among others.

For Prayer


O God of the harvest,
