"Unbind him and let him go."

FROM JOHN 11:3-7, 17, 20-27, 33b-45

Reflection

Today we read of a vivid miracle that affirms the promise of everlasting life. Miracles are dramatic in that there is no human or scientific explanation. A miracle is the power of God among us. While the first miracle at Cana (changing water into wine at a wedding) launched Jesus' ministry, this last miracle, the raising of Lazarus, marks the end of his ministry.

Miracles and teachings are often a counterpoint to the status quo. These amazing ministries drew attention to Jesus of Nazareth and challenged the powers that be with his controversial presence. Jesus is a stark contrast to the

protectors of law and ritual. He was countercultural in his teaching and genuine concern for people. Love, mercy, and compassion are the hallmarks of Jesus' life among us. Jesus worked miracles by the power of God and out of compassion for the one standing before him. Furthermore, his ministry offered hope to the community, as the recipient was restored to be a productive witness within the community.

While the raising of Lazarus reveals the power of God at work through Jesus, it also prefigures the resurrection of Jesus, and the promise of our own eventual resurrection. The dramatic power of God bursts into life, and so the need for community is highlighted.

There are times in life when the assistance of others encourages our growth and spiritual development. It is our friends who accompany us through the difficult patches in life. Those who love us "roll away the stone" that blocks life from flourishing. The command to "Come Out," releases essential grace to change, breaks out of the status quo of the struggles life brings; all the while, relying on our friendship with Jesus to break through the depression and hopelessness that weighs down one's spirit.

It is by the power of God that we rise out of death-dealing emotions, behaviors, and attitudes. We seek God's grace in the pattern of daily dying and rising in life. We attune our hearts to the voice of God calling us out and allow ourselves to be taken by the hand and lifted up to new life.
