

Reflection

May is traditionally dedicated to Mary by Catholics. On traveling to Ephesus, I had an opportunity to visit Mary's house. it is located in a beautiful forested area in the mountains and, when descending, you can view the ruins of Ephesus. During first century, Ephesus was a bustling city, estimated to have 250,000 occupants and thriving Jewish and emerging Christian populations.

Not much is known about Mary's life following the death of Jesus. We know from Acts that Mary gathered with the disciples for prayer in Jerusalem and was most likely present during the Pentecost. But what happened after that? Some scholars believe that Mary remained in Jerusalem until she was assumed into heaven. Still others believe that John, who was commissioned by Jesus to care for Mary like a son, took her to Ephesus when he began evangelizing in the Roman province of Asia.

One legend has it that John and Mary escaped Jerusalem and stayed in a cave before moving to a home on Bulbul Mountain in what is now Turkey. The cave has been a Christian sacred site since the first or second century. The House of the Virgin Mary, a small stone structure, is a pilgrimage site visited by both Christians and Muslims. The House was found after Anne Catherine Emmerich experienced a vision about the location of the house, and while not authenticated by the Church, it has been visited by Popes Paul VI and Benedict the XVI.
