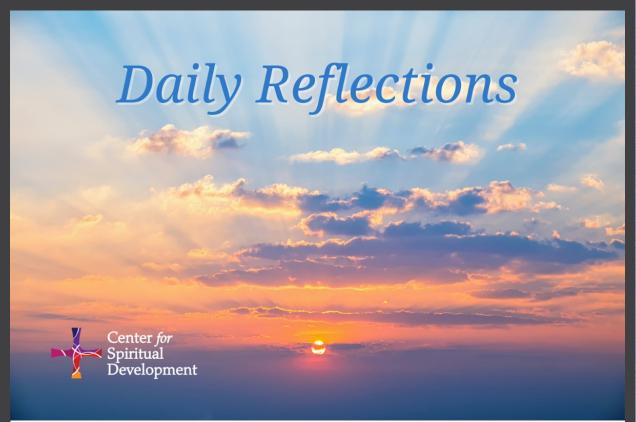

The sides of the ship were so close to the edge of the Canal that from my room balcony I was able to lean over and touch the concrete wall. We bussed over to the Pacific side of the Canal, visited the Miraflores Lock and museum, saw a number of ships (including a submarine) going through the Canal, and returned to the ship by way of the Panama Canal Railway. The train had to stop in the middle of the lake to allow another train to pass, which gave us time to enjoy the jungle scenery.

On our return journey we made one more stop in Limon, Costa Rica, where we visited a site in the rainforest, saw and heard howler monkeys hanging from the trees, and experienced local music and dance. What an adventure! Would I have ever thought in my wildest imaginings that such a journey would take place? Thanks to my friend who loved life and all it has to offer, and appreciated the gift that life is, the unexpected happened. Sharing life and adventures with friends is such a blessing, and doesn't God hold surprises and favor with both?

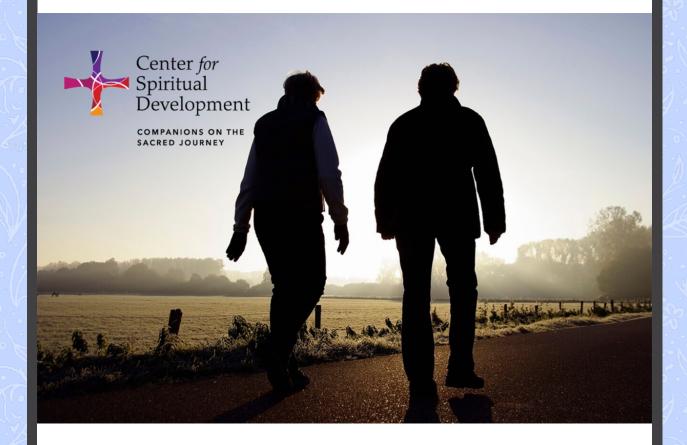
