#### Reflection


While living in Japan in 1961, the island nation was impacted by Super Typhoon Nancy. The Typhoon was rated as a category 5 and one of the worst storm events in Japan. Winds were estimated at over 200 miles per hour, and as a nine-year-old, I was terrified. The gales whipped furiously, blowing unsecured objects everywhere and shaking our duplex ruthlessly. We got through the storm without damage in part because we were well above sea level

and facing Sagami Bay instead of open ocean.

Typhoons are an extreme example of the significance of oceans to the environment. They are conveyer belts of energy and generators of climate. The delicate relationship between land and sea, rainfall, air temperature, oxygen, and existence of all life is sacred precision. Climate change and increasing populations pose an existential threat to that balance. Our oceans are struggling -- too much carbon, and increasing acidity, too much trash, too much usage and overfishing. Not surprising information and yet, worth restating.

Have you ever traveled on the open sea? It's breathtaking and disconcerting with the sheer vastness of space, color, light and movement. There's also a sublime peace that surfaces from the motion as a vessel glides through the water. The fragrance of fresh sea air is invigorating and soothing. Such experiences can evoke profound gratitude and wonder.

On the third day of creation, dry lands, seas, plants and trees were created. And, in the beginning, as God was initiating the act of creation, "...the Spirit of God moved upon the face of the waters." (Genesis 1:2) What a remarkable image, the breath of the Sacred dancing upon the oceans. How are you called to revere the sacred gift of the seas?
