Today's Gospel

Jesus said to his disciples:

"What is your opinion?

If a man has a hundred sheep and one of them goes astray, will he not leave the ninety-nine in the hills and go in search of the stray?

And if he finds it, amen, I say to you, he rejoices more over it than over the ninety-nine that did not stray.

In just the same way, it is not the will of your heavenly Father that one of these little ones be lost."

MATTHEW 18:12-14

I think of the times where I have been upset with God because things didn't go the way I wanted and I felt like I was being punished when in reality, God was just trying to keep me safe.

God rejoices when we make our way back because we choose to do so out of our own free will that has been given to us.
