## Reflection

The readings for today, along with the Responsorial Psalm, 79, are all about turning away from God and living lives counter to who we say we are. While we might want to shy away from the strong condemnation found in these readings, it's best that we heed the messages found within them.

We are human and therefore we sin and lose our way. The message today is to

take stock of our lives and make an honest self-assessment on how we're doing in the eyes of the Lord. I find the daily Examen of St. Ignatius a wonderful tool to help guide my own life and see where I could be doing better in being the person I'm called to be.

The Examen is a gentle way to see God's interaction in our day and where we might have missed an opportunity to see the face of God, or the movement of God, in the people and circumstances of our day.

Perhaps the tyranny of time caused us to turn away from someone who needed just a moment of our attention. Perhaps we were oblivious to the person right before us who needed a smile, a gesture of welcome, or simply acknowledgement that they were there. It doesn't have to be large missteps or mishaps that can lead us down the roads of woe; it can be everyday, little "somethings" that in the end, chip away at the person we know God created us to be. Without prayer and an honest look at ourselves, we can easily find ourselves on the roads of woe in our lives!

O roads of woe you beckon, slipping into my life in unexpected ways. Grant me the grace, O Lord, to pivot onto the paths where your footsteps lead me.

# **For Pondering**


