Reflection

Jesus knew the experience of hunger and the weakness that results. Scripture demonstrates that he was keenly aware of the needs and hunger of the people among whom he lived and worked. Recognition of the hungers of the people impelled him to respond, to give of himself, and to witness to the great love of God in every encounter.


These same hungers reside in my life and in the life of every human person at all ages. Our conflicted society reverberates with the physical, social, and

spiritual needs of all humanity. The manner of addressing human hunger can be conflicted as well, despite it being a Gospel mandate! People are struggling to have basic needs met daily. Needs for food, clothing, shelter, healthcare. Others seek to find meaning and purpose in their lives while also seeking spiritual nourishment. Too often people seem undervalued, and their dignity repressed.

Jesus taught the disciples to address the physical, social, and spiritual hungers of the people, and in the end it cost him everything. No matter your faith tradition, addressing human suffering is your mandate as well. It is vital that each of us address our own hunger and needs and, at the same time, work to relieve the hunger of each person we encounter.

Some needs may be beyond our capacity to relieve. Yet, in the day-to-day there is much we can do to offer the food of dignity, respect, attentive listening, seeing the best in the other, and reverence for all life.

I must admit that often my heart aches with what must break God's heart. Together, with like-minded people, we can discover ways to address the hungers of humanity and collaborate to address the ills as best we can. I pray in this "Year of Hope" to awaken to what is mine to do in each circumstance. You and I have within us all we need to strengthen the dear neighbor without distinction.

You have gifted me with all I need to witness to


your great love and abiding presence in this world.
