Today's Responsorial Psalm

Reflection

I chose to focus on the responsorial psalm for today because of the message found within it. It is so tempting and easy to lose our way, to lose our focus in life. The distractions are everywhere around us. We are constantly being bombarded with advertisements, texts, emails, and the noise of the world both within and outside of ourselves. In the quiet of our lives, we can be mindful of who we were created to be. It is a time to reflect on the choices we're making in life and whether these are leading us toward God and the service of his people. With our mind, heart, and eyes focused on the God who birthed creation into being, we can calm the noise that surrounds us and remain grounded in who we are as pilgrims on the way.

The words "you are my hope" are simple, yet profound. If we hope in anything other than God, then our hope is misguided and off-kilter. It is a time to reflect, pray, and give thanks to God for the day, the people I've encountered, and the ability to see and experience the Holy Spirit at work in the world. It is a time to reflect on how tomorrow is another chance to pour out my love for others.
