

# **Today's Verse Before the Gospel**

Cast away from you all the crimes you have committed, says the LORD, and make for yourselves a new heart and a new spirit.

**EZEKIEL 18:31** 

## Reflection

Goodness and sinfulness are woven into the fabric of humanity. We are created in the image and likeness of God. We are called to be Holy while living in shadow. The way to holiness is that of integrity, where the inside and outside of me flow freely in the way of goodness, beauty, truth, and unity. That means attending to my inner life in self-reflection, where ego is appropriately managed, and transformation is possible, so that I might be transformed into the inclusive person God created me to be. The universal call is found in the

golden rule of religious/spiritual traditions. Take a look! The call to holiness is worth consideration!

#### The Golden Rule

**BAHA'I FAITH** - Lay not on any soul a load that you would not wish to be laid upon you, and desire not for anyone the things you would not desire for yourself.

**BAHA'U'LLAH; GLEANINGS** 

**HINDUISM** - This is the sum of duty: do not do to others what would cause pain if done to you.

**MAHABHARATA 5:1517** 

BUDDHISM - Treat not others in ways that you yourself would find hurtful.

**UDANA-VARGA 5.18** 

**CONFUCIANISM** - One word which sums up the basis of all good conduct ... *loving kindness*. Do not do to others what you do not want done to yourself.

**CONFUCIUS; ANALECTS 15.23** 

**ISLAM** - Not one of you truly believes until you wish for others what you wish for yourself.

**TAOISM** - Regard your neighbor's gain as your own gain, and your neighbor's loss as your own loss.

**JUDAISM** - What is hateful to you, do not do to your neighbor. This is the whole Torah; all the rest is commentary.

**JESUS; MATTHEW 7:12** 



Thank You that wherever Your presence is perceived, there is transformation.


Now lift our eyes beyond the schisms and hostility we see around us.
