Background

In the Roman Catholic liturgical calendar, today is the Feast of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph, one of several feasts during the Christmas season that help us to reflect on the humanity of Jesus. The Feast of the Holy Family was established in 1893 as an optional celebration and became a feast for the universal Church in 1931. At that time, it was a call to remember and preserve the holiness of family life amid the immense social changes of the 20th

century.

Thoughts About Family

The dictionary defines a family as a group of one or more parents and their children living together as a unit and also as all the descendants of a common ancestor.

In sociology, a family is a group of people who are related by birth, marriage, adoption, or cohabitation, and who live together and form emotional connections. Families are socially recognized groups that serve as economic units of society. They are the most basic social unit in human society. Family today can be described as nuclear, extended, blended, chosen.

The genealogy of Jesus--"Jacob the father of Joseph, the husband of Mary. Of her was born Jesus who is called the Messiah." Mathew 1:16


