

# **Today's Gospel**

After John had been arrested,
Jesus came to Galilee proclaiming the gospel of God:

#### Reflection

As a teenager, I was enamored with John's Gospel, so full of mystery and intricate narrative. As I have grown older, Mark and Matthew have caught my fancy. Mark in particular gives me pause with his "just the facts ma'am" style. In today's reading, Jesus is beginning his ministry in Galilee, preaching the Good News. The chronicle has moved very quickly from his baptism, to his temptation in the wilderness, to this point in the Gospel. Ready to do his Father's work, he begins with haste. Along the way, he encounters Simon Peter and Andrew, then James and John, and Jesus extends an invitation to all of them to come follow him as his disciples.

What compelled the four men to suddenly drop everything and follow Jesus? Can you imagine? They probably had no idea what they were getting into, but they knew it was the right thing to do. Their families must have been astounded; this was literally a life-and-death decision when it came to subsistence and basic survival.

Perhaps this is a perfect example of what it means to act with blind faith. Even as men of God, to drop everything and follow a stranger and risk the welfare of loved ones is extraordinarily inspired and implies a confidence that all will be well in the hands of God. For Christians, the invitation is to follow Jesus. Certainly, the response to do so is unique to each person. Where and how do you find the invitation to be a disciple of Jesus?
