

Today's First Reading



Reflection

Today's gospel continues to unfold the spirituality of the Sermon on the Mount beginning in Matthew 5. If our only focus in life is primarily to build treasures on earth that can be destroyed or stolen, we will be consumed by efforts to protect these treasures or driven by greed to amass more than we need. In contrast, as people of faith, we are called to renounce all acts of violence or war that aim to protect our accumulated wealth, whether it is to grasp land that is not our own, or land with precious minerals in the ground, or natural resources like fresh water that need to be shared for the common good.

So, what are the treasures we long to receive based on the Lord's Prayer that we considered yesterday (Matthew 6:7-15)? We are called to set our hearts on God's reign, a way of being that provides for everyone's needs, a simple way of living that respects others' struggle to simply live, and a manner of being in the world that is compassionate so that no one goes without their basic rights for food, shelter and the dignity of honest work. We are called to set our hearts completely on the God of love, the God of compassion, the God of peace. Only then will the lamp of the body, the eye, be filled with light that illuminates the treasure of our heart, a treasure that lasts forever.

My soul shall be filled as with a banquet, my mouth shall praise you with joy.


On my bed I remember you. On you I muse through the night for you have been my help; in the shadow of your wings I rejoice.
