Reflection

Back in the late 1960's, television programming was certainly much more limited than it is today. In addition to regular programming such as the Ed Sullivan Show, The Dick Van Dyke Show, Bonanza or the Beverly Hillbillies,

certain channels, like today, featured movies. During the Christmas or Easter seasons, it was not unusual for stations to feature classic films like *Going My Way, The Bells of St. Mary's*, or *The Song of Bernadette*. The last film stands out having won the first Golden Globe and multiple Oscars. It was also one of the first films to be broadcast on television independent of station ownership. I imagine that millions of people have viewed the film and, in fact, you can still stream it today on multiple platforms.

What is it about this film that still draws people even after eighty years? The film itself and the performances were exceptional. Yet the story, although not entirely accurate as portrayed in the film, seems to capture people's hearts. The story of a poor and humble young teenage girl living in the rural Pyrenees during the mid-1800's and experiencing Marian apparitions is incredible and moving. Her persistence in the face of ridicule and disbelief is equally amazing. The resulting pilgrimage site in Lourdes, and the miraculous healing associated with the spring waters, draws millions of pilgrims each year.

Within this context, we witness the promise of hope and healing through Mary's intercession. We are not forgotten but held tightly by Our Lady of Lourdes, Our Mother, Help of the Afflicted. Blessings on the Feast Day, Memorial of Our Lady of Lourdes. Clearly the scripture passage leading into this reflection offers only a glimpse of the tenacity of Mary's intercession.
