

## Reflection

The readings from today flow nicely from yesterday's because we're being

invited to continue reflecting on God's mercy and what it means for us to live a life of generosity of heart that flows from the Divine love we receive. It's through God's grace that we remain rooted in our faith, and it's that grace that continually points us to our desire for eternal life.

In the first reading from Romans, St. Paul reminds us that God's love and invitation to us are irrevocable. God has promised us and God does not renege on promises! Think of how often you and I stray from our journey with God. Each time, God's mercy is there to bring us back, to forgive us, and lead us away from sin and distraction. How I wish the mercy I have for others were even a tenth of God's infinite and loving mercy. This naturally evokes the virtue of humility in us because God's love is not something we earn; it is freely given to us, and we need simply to respond. It is a reminder for us to give praise and thanksgiving to the God who constantly beckons us.

The gospel reading is a challenging one for me because naturally I would want to invite family, friends, and people I know to any dinner I might be hosting. If we dig deeper, this passage means so much more than this. This speaks to the type of love God is calling forth from each of us. It's all about loving for love's sake. When we love, let us strive for "no strings attached" love that flows freely and generously from hour hearts.

These readings call us to seek opportunities to serve others, forgive others (and ourselves), and cultivate attitudes of the heart where our desire to love our dear neighbors comes naturally and with joy.
