Reflection

Even though the apostles had been with Jesus for three years, the swirl of doubt and confusion filtered through their reality. Belief and confidence in the resurrection of Jesus is pure gift of faith. 2000 years later, personal experience of the risen Jesus gleaned though reflection on the scriptures, the sharing of faith experiences with people central to our lives, and spiritual practices continue to form us as Easter People! As followers of Jesus, I hope that my life witnesses to Gospel values!

And yet, I—and we—don't always get it right any more than Thomas and the other apostles did so long ago. Doubt, fear, confusion, and living an

unreflective life often prohibit faith and belonging to Jesus in a conscious manner. Loving Jesus takes a lifetime of prayer, reflection, conscious discernment, and intention.

For me three opportunities have formed and deepened my faith and personal relationship with Jesus: Personal daily prayer and reflection on Scripture; long ago a 30-day Ignatian retreat, and a recent pilgrimage to the Holy Land. For me the person of Jesus is alive and tangible; daily discernment to "put on the mind of Jesus" (Philippians 2) so to know him more intimately continues to shape my belonging, my love of Jesus. While I have not seen him with my eyes, the eyes of faith reveal him in amazing ways. My heart is moved to seek him and love him who comes in many disguises. I agree with St. Peter:

"Although [I] have not seen him [I] love him;
even though [I] do not see him now yet believe in him,
[I] rejoice with an indescribable and glorious joy,
as [I] attain the goal of [my] faith, the salvation of [my] soul."

For Pondering


- In what disguises have I encountered Jesus in my life?
