Reflection

As a Sister, sometimes I feel like I'm a lamb sent among wolves. What do I mean by that? An example was a talk I gave to a few students from LMU's

Center for Service and Action, about 10 of them, just recently. The person who contacted me said to talk about the Sisters of St Joseph of Orange and our charism. She wanted the students to see their connection with the Sisters of St. Joseph. She contacted me two days before and told me that all they needed was a 30-minute talk. These students are leaders themselves. They lead over 300 students at LMU in volunteering in the community across different social justice focuses -- mental health awareness, domestic violence awareness and action, education mentorship, homelessness, environmental justice and human trafficking, restorative justice, feminism, and even food justice. They have already been doing ministry and are leaders in their area of service. With just two days to prepare -- and amid computer issues -- I wrote a 3-paragraph statement of the charism of the CSJOs, the ministries we have, and the compassionate and transforming presence that goes with the services that we do. I was nervous; I always get nervous when called on for ad hoc talks and conversations.

Then I was reminded of the scripture quoted earlier. I recalled, the apostles were sent, like lambs to wolves. They had barely received instructions and had hardly understood the teachings from Jesus. I'm sure some of them were wondering what to say to the people they would meet, how they could do Jesus's works.

What I forget is that *Jesus is the one sending*! When Jesus sends, *He sends His spirit with us*. That sent Spirit gifts us with fortitude, wisdom, understanding, counsel, knowledge, piety, and awe of the Lord, if we remain and abide with God. *The Spirit of God, of Jesus, goes before us to wherever we are sent*. This is why Jesus said, "*Ask the master of the harvest* to send out laborers for his harvest." *Jesus supplies everything* needed to labor and work in his vineyard and so that the harvest is good. God stands beside us and gives us strength to do what we were sent to do. God is near to all who call upon him, to all who call upon him in truth.

All of us are called to his vineyard. We are all sent. We just need to say yes, pray, believe, and abide in Him, the One who sent. As sisters usually say, we just need to show up. Take courage and *He will do the rest*.

The picture that comes along with this reflection was taken when I was driving in Thousand Oaks just a few months before I entered the Sisters of St. Joseph of Orange to be a religious Sister. I can vividly remember that I was having a conversation with God, and I told God that I fully consented to going to the Sisters, where I felt God was leading me. All I asked of God at that time was to never let go of my hand and to give me everything I needed for the journey. Not long after I finished that prayer, the picture is what showed up in the skies. (Of

course, I pulled over before taking the picture.)

P.S. The talk with the LMU students went well and there were curiosities raised and I was able to comfortably answer their questions.


