#### Reflection

Ironically, it is the small, unimportant town of Bethlehem that the prophet Micah notes will be the birthplace of the Davidic messianic ruler of Israel. It is noteworthy that in God's scheme of things it is the most "unimportant" that produces the most significant.

The image of the humble shepherd easily recalls David. It is through the strength of God that King David is able to "shepherd" Israel. As his greatness reaches the farthest regions of the world, this new Davidic king from insignificant Bethlehem will be peace to the whole earth.

Since at least the  $7^{th}$  century, the birth of Mary has been celebrated this day, which is situated during the harvest season. She is thus remembered in the midst of life being brought forth to nourish and sustain. Such is the image of Mary.
