Reflection

Many years ago, I had an encounter with a woman who helped me realize the truth of the blessing uttered in the second letter of St. Peter: "grace and peace [is] yours in abundance through knowledge of God and of Jesus our Lord."

I met her at the reception following my grandfather's funeral. She was a distant friend of the family. All I knew of her was that she was a single mother raising her daughter, who had Down Syndrome. Her life seemed lonely and hard.

She came to me and offered condolences. She then said, "I have been watching you and you seem so happy. I think it is because you know God. I have always wanted to know God, but I can't know him." I was surprised and touched by the encounter. I muttered my thanks and said, "Yes, I am happy." I have never forgotten the encounter and have long wished that I had told her that the fact she wanted to know God is evidence that God knows her and desires her to know God, too. Perhaps she needed someone to point the way through the darkness.

Knowing God through the ups and downs of life has been transformative. Discovering God in surprising and ordinary ways, in many disguises in my life and that of others, has been a blessing, a consolation. There are times when God is as close as my breath; others when I seem to lose touch. Pausing to refocus is often helpful to my quest. A quote from a card by Sister Madeleva comes to mind: "God sometimes hides just around the corner and coughs to let me know where he is." Coming to know God is never finished; it is a slow and gentle process. Being known by God is a grace and a peace like no other. God sustains, upholds, inspires, nourishes, and loves me, especially when I least expect it. I am blessed indeed. I have had many gentle and compassionate guides along the way.

The desire to know God is God seeking us out. Sometimes, it is a matter of learning to discern the face and presence of God in unexpected ways, places, and people. We need to assist one another to discover God in the ordinary, simple joys, delights, and precious moments, even when life is hard and lonely.
