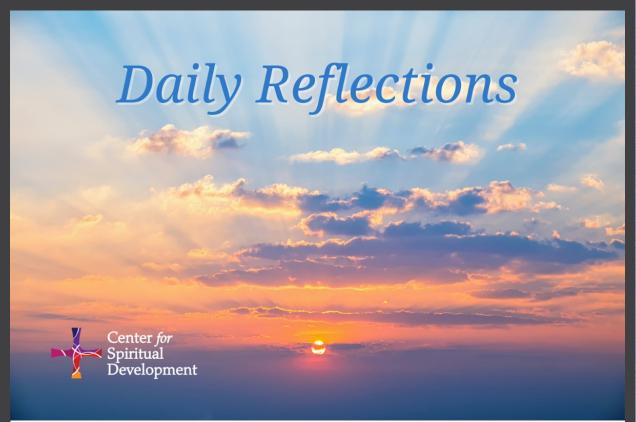

As she was preparing to leave the following morning, she was approached by a little boy holding a puppy. He proceeded to implore the woman to take the puppy to his aunt who lived somewhere in L.A. He sadly

explained that four of the puppies from the litter had died from the heat and the only chance for the remaining puppy to live, from the little man's perspective, was to take the tiny creature to a cooler place. He explained his aunt would be expecting her and proceeded to give the traveler an address.

The woman said "yes" to the request and prepared a place for the puppy which included ice, a towel, and an ice chest donated by a maid from the hotel where she had stayed. She placed the canine foundling on the towel "on ice." This may seem excessive; however, the woman explained to my friend that even with the air conditioner on, the extreme heat had caused her internal car thermometer to register over 100°. She wanted to make sure the puppy made it to its foster home safely. The puppy was received by the waiting aunt as planned.




