

SCARCITY AND ABUNDANCE

Introduction

A lot has been written about scarcity and abundance. A scarcity mindset is when someone believes there is not enough of something, whether it's time, resources, opportunities, or even love. By contrast, a person with an abundance mindset believes there is more than enough to go around for everyone, and that there are limitless possibilities and resources available.

People with a scarcity mindset tend to focus on what they don't have, what is missing, or what they might lose; they are often driven by fear of not having enough. Those who have an abundance mindset focus on what's available and possible.

A sense of scarcity can lead to impaired cognitive thinking because the brain is constantly stressed by the fear of not having enough and a sense of abundance can lead to increased happiness, resilience, and overall wellbeing.

Today's reading from Paul's second letter to the Corinthians is a continuation of his invitation to participate in a collection for the needs of Christians in Jerusalem (see Tuesday, June 17, 2025 reflection).

As you read, note the language of abundance.

Brothers and sisters, consider this:
whoever sows sparingly will also reap sparingly,
and whoever sows bountifully will also reap bountifully.
Each must do as already determined, without sadness or compulsion,
for God loves a cheerful giver.

Moreover, God is able to make every grace abundant for you, so that in all things, always having all you need, you may have an abundance for every good work.

As it is written:

He scatters abroad, he gives to the poor; his righteousness endures forever.

The one who supplies seed to the sower and bread for food will supply and multiply your seed and increase the harvest of your righteousness. You are being enriched in every way for all generosity, which through us produces thanksgiving to God.
