

Today's Gospel

Lifting up his eyes to heaven, Jesus prayed, saying:

"Holy Father, keep them in your name

that you have given me,

so that they may be one just as we are one.

When I was with them I protected them in your name that you gave me,

and I guarded them, and none of them was lost

except the son of destruction,

in order that the Scripture might be fulfilled.

But now I am coming to you.

I speak this in the world

so that they may share my joy completely.

Reflection

We live in a world full of contradictions: beauty and violence, connection and isolation, hope and cynicism. And yet, Jesus sends us into this very world, not to withdraw from its pain but to remain in it as bearers of light. He prays that we may be one, as he and the Father are one, a unity built on divine love that embraces difference and calls us into deeper communion.

Jesus names the world's hatred to acknowledge the cost of love. Living as people of truth and compassion means we will sometimes stand apart from the values of power, greed, or indifference. But we are not alone. "I consecrate myself for them," Jesus says. He stands with us, walks with us, and blesses the path forward.

In his inaugural address, Pope Leo XIV emphasized the importance of unity and mission within the Church. He stated: "Together, as one people, as brothers and sisters, let us walk towards God and love one another." As followers of Christ, we are called to embody this unity and mission. Our commitment to truth and love becomes a beacon of hope in a world often marked by division and strife.

Rooted in Jesus' prayer and strengthened by his presence, we are invited to love boldly, to listen deeply, and to remain steadfast in hope. May our lives reflect the unity Christ desires, and may we walk together toward God, carrying light into every place.
