Reflection

In this second week of Easter, I find myself musing about the resurrection of Jesus and its ramifications for my daily life. The person of Jesus fascinates me, I cannot turn away. I am intrigued by his countercultural stance and witness to the Great Love of God. His presence is always with me, causing me to "seek what is above, where Christ is seated at the right hand of God" (Col. 3:1).

It seems to me that who I am, my own self-identity, is woven through with God's great abiding love. This love, this knowing, is always just on the edge of my mind and firmly rooted in my heart. Is this the power and promise of the resurrection of Jesus Christ?

Generally, I experience myself as loved, chosen, sent by God to witness to the lavish love of God made tangible in Jesus. This great love nourishes and sustains my life and enables me to witness by faith-filled action and ministry. The promise realized in Jesus' resurrection is intricately tied to my own being raised in Christ.

I yearn to experience more intimately God's extravagant love so that I might more faithfully seek to BE God's love in the world. This, too, is radically countercultural—to give oneself so completely for the life of others as Jesus did. Who does that in a society that promotes turning a blind eye to unjust structures to acquire success, financial gain, and self-interest first, last, and always? A bit harsh? Perhaps, yet, worldly values often stand in stark contrast to the ways of Jesus.

Having been "raised with Christ," I long to love, not by society's standards but those of Jesus who reverenced the person standing before him even when the other seemed threatening. He remained compassionate, merciful, inclusive, and forgiving to all he encountered, even to the cost of his life. His is a spirit of self-gift and a language of love first, last, and always. This is the Spirit that raised Jesus from the dead and in whom I am raised up to God's abiding and embrace.
