tree that is planted beside the flowing waters, that yields its fruit in due season and whose leaves shall never fade; and all that they do shall prosper.


PSALM 1:1-3 (GRAIL TRANSLATION)

Isaiah says that God teaches us what is for our good ... if only we would listen. The psalmist invites us to take delight in God's Word, day and night. Let us be awake during these Advent days for the "inbreaking" of God's desire to teach us and to form us into the person God dreams us into becoming.
