## Reflection

Folks enter into spiritual direction for any number of reasons. One request frequently expressed by the people I companion is the desire to strengthen their prayer practice. In many cases, this entails intentionally carving out time to pray or trying out different prayer practices to see what sticks or inspires. In today's virtual world, the options are numerous, from prayer groups, to podcasts, and social networks. Where to begin? Is this perhaps one of your New Year's resolutions? Here are a few things to ponder.

What is the meaning of prayer to you? This question assumes a layered and complex response. Is it praise or worship of God? Does it mean being present

to or just being with God? Is it one or two-way conversation? Is it communal or private? What is it to you?

Where do you like to pray? What is your geography of prayer, your sacred space? A church, in nature, in the privacy of your home, while driving your car, where is the place that inspires you and opens your heart to God?

How much time do you have available to dedicate to intentional prayer? Are you amenable to "praying as you go"? How is your prayer life contained or expanded by time and space?

How do you like to pray? Again, the assumption with this question is that prayer can take many forms and is not restricted to a style or form. This might include a variety of things such as praying the Rosary, devotions, centering prayer, walking contemplation, journaling, artistic endeavors, liturgy, music. Take some time to explore your preferences.

Lastly, how has God invited you to be in communion and conversation? What is your desire? "Prayer is more than paying attention to the holy. Prayer comes about as an event. It consists of two inner acts: an act of turning and an act of direction. I leave the world behind as well as all interests of the self. Divested of all concerns, I am overwhelmed by only one desire: to place my heart upon the altar of God" (Abraham Joshua Heschel, *Moral Grandeur and Spiritual Audacity*).
