
An Excerpt from Today's Second Reading

Always be ready to give an explanation to anyone who asks for a reason for your hope, but do it with gentleness and reverence, keeping your conscience clear, so that, when you are maligned, those who defame your good conduct in Christ may themselves be put to shame. For it is better to suffer for doing good, if that be the will of God, than for doing evil. For Christ also suffered for sins once, the righteous for the sake of the unrighteous, that he might lead you to God.

1 PETER 3:15-18

The author of this letter knows that the Christian recipients are already suffering. They are urged to respond gently and respectfully with hope. Not only does this way of life give them support, it gives witness to their sustaining and fulfilling relationship with the Holy One.

Jesus suffered as an innocent person for the sake of the not-so-innocent. Those reading this letter find themselves in "good company," so to speak. Choosing a way to respond to one's suffering is a continual challenge, yet it does not have to be a burden. Gentleness and hope suggest a freedom of heart that is stronger than any suffering.

For Prayer


Loving, caring God,
