Today's Gospel

Reflection

This feast of the birth of John the Baptist was established very early in the Christian church's history, at about the same time as the feast of Christmas. The old customs that centered around the summer solstice became ways to recognize and honor John. The Northern Hemisphere receives more daylight than any other day of the year on the summer solstice. This day marks the start of astronomical summer, when days start to become shorter and nights longer.

In some parts of the world, "St. John's fires" are burned and people stay up all night into the day to tend the flames. In Poland, wreaths with lighted candles are tossed into streams to float downriver. The Koran calls John a great prophet so in Morocco, Muslims light fires to celebrate his birth. Doors, automobiles and buses are decorated with green birch twigs. In Lithuania a cheese sweetened with honey is prepared in a round shape to resemble the sun. The honey is a reminder of one of the foods John ate in the desert.
