JIMMY CARTER, PEACEMAKER (1924-2024)

His Story

Former U.S. President Jimmy Carter was born on October 1, 1924, in Plains, Georgia. In 1946, he graduated from the U.S Naval Academy and married Rosalynn Smith. After several years in submarine service, Carter left active duty in 1953, and he and Rosalynn returned to the family's peanut farm in Plains. Carter served in the inactive Navy reserve until 1961 and left with the rank of lieutenant. During those years, he received many awards.

In 1963-1967, Carter served as Georgia State Senator and, in 1971-1975, Governor of Georgia. As a member of the Democratic Party, Carter was active in the human rights movement and was openly committed to desegregation. As Governor, he set up centers for mentally disabled children and educational programs for convicts. In 1977, Carter was inaugurated the **39th President of the U.S.**

Despite a rocky presidency, **Carter's post-presidency** years, **1981-2024**, were mainly focused on diplomacy and peacekeeping in the Middle East, Northern Ireland, North Korea, Taiwan, Venezuela, South Africa and Syria. In the U.S., Carter built homes (Habitat for Humanity) after the devastation of Hurricane Sandy. He also worked with former presidents to help the victims of Hurricane Harvey and Hurricane Irma in the Gulf Coast and Texas communities. **The Carter Center**, which Jimmy and Rosalynn founded in Atlanta, Georgia in 1982, has worked to eradicate Guinea Worm Disease: in 2022 there were only 13 human cases in the world; in 1986 there were 3.5 million human cases in 21 countries in Africa and Asia. The disease is expected to be 100% eradicated by 2030. This will be the only disease that has been eradicated since smallpox in 1980. For 40 years, the Carter Center has worked in more than 90 countries to resolve conflicts, advance democracy, protect human rights, prevent disease and improve mental health. Among his many awards and honors, Jimmy Carter won the **Nobel Peace Prize** in 2002 for undertaking peace negotiations, campaigning for human rights and working for social welfare.
