
Turning to One Another, 33

Reflection

Recently, at a gathering, I helped to facilitate a "World Café." It had been years since I had helped to guide such a process and in preparing for the day, I reviewed the seven principles bolstering the approach. A "World Café" process recognizes that we all come with different perspectives, and that the "sum is greater than the parts," and that there is innovation and potential insights to be

gained through sustained and diverse participation in conversation. The foundational platform to begin the dialogue process is setting the context to help focus the conversation and to convey a vision for effort. The activity recognizes the value of each person's engagement and contribution, and celebrates the "colaboring" of community toward a common, albeit not "cookie-cutter" interest. In the instance referenced herein, the Holy Spirit was implored through prayer to help guide the day. As observed by this humble facilitator, the occasion was full of community, active contemplation, fun and contentment in the co-laboring.

This experience gave me pause to reflect on several questions that are timely as a Christian lifted by the promises of Easter, and as a person living in our current time. What does it mean to be radically inclusive? To receive and serve the dear neighbor without distinction? How are we called to unifying love with God and each other? When am I called to suspend judgement, to just be with people as they are and where they are, even if it is discordant from my milieu? What does it mean to offer unmitigated hospitality, to receive the stranger as a part of the community? How are we called to be curious about one another, to listen to stories with not only understanding but also with empathetic and compassionate witness? It seems there may be some work to do.
