The seventy-two disciples returned rejoicing and said to Jesus, "Lord, even the demons are subject to us because of your name." ... "All things have been handed over to me by my Father. No one knows who the Son is except the Father, and who the Father is except the Son and anyone to whom the Son wishes to reveal him." Turning to the disciples in private he said, "Blessed are the eyes that see what you see. For I say to you, many prophets and kings desired to see what you see, but did not see it, and to hear what you hear, but did not hear it."

Reflection

Earlier this week, on Thursday, we heard about Jesus sending the 72 disciples out to the towns and villages before his arrival. Today, we hear the joy and

excitement of their return as they share with the Lord how they were able to cast out demons because of Jesus' name and because he had sent them on this mission.

We, too, are being called and sent as followers of Jesus, committed to preaching, teaching, and spreading the Good News. While we were not witnesses to Jesus in his time, we are witnesses to the Spirit's work in our lives and the lives of others in the present. Sometimes it's not easy; and yet, my hunch is that you can recall times where you've been the conduit of God's tender mercies through your presence, actions, or words. Many of us might not be healers in the physical sense; I believe that we are and can be conduits of healing in the spiritual sense. We can bring the Living Word to those with whom we live, work, and interact each day. It is our call – our mission – to do so!

May my eyes open wide to the vision you see, O Lord. Let me see with the tenderness of your gaze, and the searching eyes that spring from your heart Divine.
