MEMORIAL OF THE IMMACULATE HEART OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY

Today's Gospel Acclamation

Blessed is the Virgin Mary who kept the word of God and pondered it in her heart.

LUKE 2:19

Reflection

Yesterday was the feast of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, and today is the memorial of the Immaculate Heart of Mary, the Mother of Jesus. It is appropriate that one follows the other as each lived a life completely devoted to God in a gracious and valiantly loving manner. Reflecting on the inner disposition of their hearts provides a glimpse into how to live a Life in God through self-emptying love and fidelity to grace.

"The Immaculate Heart of Mary is a Catholic devotion that honors the Virgin Mary's love and purity for God. It symbolizes her faith, mercy, trust, and welcoming of Christ, as well as her total purity. The devotion also refers to Mary's interior life, including her joys, sorrows, virtues, and hidden perfections." (Newman Ministry)

Mary has been a central figure in Christianity, and in the Catholic faith, from the beginning. It was her "yes" to God which made the Incarnation possible. Through her, Jesus entered our world. She is the first Christian, the first follower of Jesus, the exemplar of faith for us. Mary's singlehearted love points the way to her son. She was present and stood in solidarity with Jesus as he suffered unspeakable cruelty. Despite suffering the agony as his mother, she remained, pondering all in her heart -- such was the immensity of her selfless love and devotion. From the cross, Jesus gave her to us as our spiritual mother.

Since the early Church, artists have tried to express their love of and respect for Mary. Through art, Mary has been remembered in countless ways. Each sculpture, icon, painting, drawing, poem, piece of prose, litany, song, and dance has attempted to give shape to Mary. She often is seen through the lens of culture and is often depicted as people see themselves.

Reflect upon her inner experience through how she is portrayed in scripture. Step aside from the stereotype of Mary as perfection, for the stories reveal a very human person who experienced the fullest reality of life in suffering and challenges, as well as the wonder of love, beauty, relationships of family life, of joy and peace, of disappointment and the heart-felt tragedy of the cross. I seek to remove the distorted lens of Mary being other than human and awaken to the very human emotions and experiences of a life well lived as a woman of faith encountering the fullness of life's wild ride. Only then does the heart of Mary offer a place of solace and understanding of our own experiences. Like Mary, we ponder all life brings and discover God with us.
