God created man in his image;
in the divine image he created him;
male and female he created them.

GENESIS 1:26-27

Reflection

The Book of Genesis proclaims the essential belief in *the dignity of the human person created in God's image and likeness.* The principles of our faith flow from our God-given dignity, given to us by God of Love from the beginning of humanity. St. Joseph is rooted the reality of our being created in God's image; and Jesus came to reveal God's love, compassion, mercy, and desire "that all may be One." (Jn 17:21)

This means both great light and periodic darkness within me all bears God's abiding presence. Day by day, I am learning to live, and act, and pray for the grace of God's love to help me. Living with my eyes wide open and heart alert, I need to step back from my own ego drive and my false need to be perfect. With patience and humility, I seek forgiveness, or a different approach to life that will allow my best self to come forth. It takes a lifetime to live into *the likeness of God*.
