


ISAIAH 58:9-10

Nor do they light a lamp and then put it under a bushel basket; it is set on a lampstand, where it gives light to all in the house. Just so, your light must shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your heavenly Father.

Reflection

You might have had occasion recently to have experienced a "black" or "brown" out. These are particularly disconcerting at night. Appropriately, there are flashlights stashed all around my house. At a deep visceral level, darkness strikes an anxious chord in most of us. Darkness is equated with danger, evil, uncertainty and imbalance.

In today's readings, light is stressed as offering a glimpse of hope and Sacred Presence. We are given the responsibility to be God's light in the world. What does that mean in the context of darkness in today's world? What does that mean specifically to you? How would you describe the elements of darkness? What about light? Pause for a moment and engage these questions through mind, body, and spirit. Perhaps walk through the readings as you meander through the questions.
