BLESSED ARE THEY

Today's Responsorial Psalm

Blessed are they who follow the Law of the Lord.

Blessed are they whose way is blameless, who walk in the law of the Lord. Blessed are they who observe his decrees, who seek him with all their heart. With all my heart I seek you; let me not stray from your commands. Within my heart I treasure your promise, that I may not sin against you. Be good to your servant, that I may live and keep your words. Open my eyes that I may consider the wonders of your law.

PSALM 119:1-2, 10, 11, 17-18

Reflection

I chose the psalm for reflection today because both the first reading and the gospel reading are so harsh! The psalm is a gentler way to convey the message

intended for us. In the first stanza we are called to "walk in the law of the Lord." At first glance, this can seem like a no-brainer; of course we'll walk as we are called to walk as disciples. And yet, I don't find it that simple because how often can you and I find ourselves on the slippery slope of bending the precepts of the Lord? The heart of today's readings is to love one another. I know I can find myself making choices, even small ones, that don't really embrace this call to love.

For example, I can love those who are close to me, my friends, family, and other important persons in my life. What about those who are a bit more difficult? If I lean into the command to love others, then it means making choices where I might not feel all that comfortable. It's taking a seat on a bus or train beside someone with whom I might not normally interact. What if this is the person most in need of acceptance or inclusion at that moment in time? This is the stretch I find in truly loving my brothers and sisters. I want to get out of my comfort zone and truly risk the radical command to love one another ... not just loving those closest to me.

In the second and third stanzas, I'm drawn to the words "seek God with all of my heart." I have to invest time, prayer, and discernment to know the depths of my heart. It's easy to live life on the surface level; this stanza challenges me to dig deeper, give a bit more of myself and not guard my heart too closely. A closed heart, or a hesitant heart, is not the path I want to walk if I'm seeking God with all of my heart.

In the fourth stanza, the word "treasure" leaps off the page because to treasure something means to place a high value upon it. Do I treasure my relationship with God? If I do, then I will seek to live according to the gospel values given to us by Jesus. You and I can't just hold Jesus in our hearts; to treasure God requires loving responses from us — every day.

The final stanza contains the words "open my eyes." I immediately thought of the words to the song by Jesse Manibusan, "Open My Eyes, Lord." I want to share these lyrics with you because they are a prayer from the heart that is a wonderful response to the readings of today.

may we seek to deepen our relationship with you.


May we be aware of those who might need
