# **Today's Gospel**

Jesus said to the crowds,

#### Reflection

"I am the bread of life," Jesus said, not once but repeatedly.

Bread is such a simple, everyday thing. Yet Jesus uses it to describe something deeply spiritual, deeply human: nourishment, presence, sustenance.

Think about it: When was the last time someone fed your soul? Not with food, but with love? With presence? With listening? With kindness, wisdom, or truth? Maybe it was the person who called you at just the right moment, the friend who let you cry without trying to fix anything. The teacher who believed in you when you had stopped believing in yourself. The stranger who smiled and reminded you that you still mattered. That's the kind of nourishment Jesus is talking about. That's the bread of life.

He came to embody this bread -- not just to offer it, but to be it. And the more we receive this bread, the presence, compassion, healing, and love of Christ, the more we're invited to become it ourselves. When we share our lives in love, hope, honesty, and kindness, we become bread for one another. We feed the hunger that can't be seen. We sustain each other in the journey.

So today, receive the bread of life wherever it is offered to you, in presence, in love, in truth. And become that bread for someone else.

Let your life be nourishment. Let your presence be sustaining. Let your love become bread.

Let us live and be the bread of life.

May our words uplift, our actions heal, and our lives reflect Your grace.

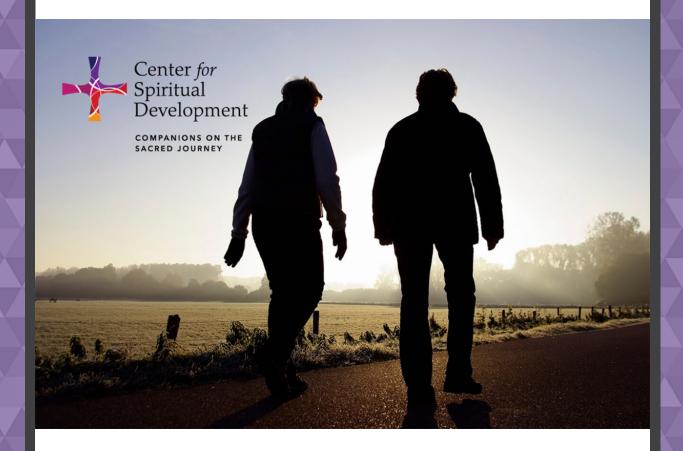
Empower us to be present, listen deeply, and love unconditionally so that others may taste and see Your goodness through us.
