Reflection

In celebrating the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe, this passage from John is startling and offers a glimpse of Jesus's divine nobility and authority. The daily readings over the past weeks have provided a glimpse of what it means to be an active participant in helping to build God's Kingdom. We find that the Kingdom is both within and without, that we are invited to love God and each other, and that as Kingdom dwellers, we have a responsibility to live out the Beatitudes as we are called. A fine thing to remember on this special day.

Does any particular verse from today's reading capture your attention? Consider this invitation to spend some time with the reading, and in particular, any passage that calls to you. Read it and contemplate the meaning as it applies to you in your lived experience — in the spirit of St. Thomas Aquinas, who notes, "Our faith is measured by divine truth … His truth, power and good outreach any measure of reason…" (*Summa Theologica*) This offer provides seven auxiliary questions used in Thomistic prayer to help guide your reflection.

- Who exemplifies living out the word or phrase? (This individual could be from scripture, a formative figure or someone you know personally.)
- What are some ways for me to strengthen my pursuit of the word or phrase?
- How can God assist me in this desire?

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
