Reflection

Reflecting the other day, I was struck with overwhelming gratitude at being witness to the beauty of our planet. Thinking back and considering the variety of places I have sojourned, a multitude of images and memories flooded into consciousness. From the startling splendor of the Engadin in the Swiss Alps, to the vastness and discrete distinctions of deserts, to the awe-striking movement and horizons of open ocean, what a gift is creation.

Beginning September 1 and running through October 4, the feast day of St. Francis of Assisi, people of many religious traditions around the world are

celebrating the *Season of Creation*. This is a singular ecumenical movement prayerfully offering thanksgiving and acting toward recognizing the gift of and working to heal our common home. The theme this year is *A Mighty River* (Amos 5: 24).

While in college, an area of study that captured my focus was the integration of sacred place in the perceptions and lived realities of people. One of the papers I wrote considered the relationship of the Diné (Navajo) people with their ancestral home and the intersection of the sacred with the ordinary and how this merged with ritual practice and expression in sand paintings and healing ceremonies. While engaged in this review, I came across the expression and belief "to walk in beauty."

Walking in beauty recognizes the sacredness of all creation and our place as a part of existence. It is a spiritual path inviting balance and respect for all of life, including the planet. Walking in beauty realizes that the Sacred seeps from the fabric of a world sparked by the Creator of all.
