Excerpts From Today's Readings

*Stephen, filled with grace and power,
was working great wonders and signs among the people.
Certain members of the so-called Synagogue of Freedmen,
Cyrenians, and Alexandrians,
and people from Cilicia and Asia,
came forward and debated with Stephen,
but they could not withstand the wisdom
and the spirit with which he spoke.*

*When they heard this, they were infuriated,
and they ground their teeth at him.
But he, filled with the Holy Spirit,
looked up intently to heaven
and saw the glory of God
and Jesus standing at the right hand of God,
and he said,
“Behold, I see the heavens opened and the Son of Man
standing at the right hand of God.”
But they cried out in a loud voice, covered their ears,
and rushed upon him together.
They threw him out of the city and began to stone him.*

*The witnesses laid down their cloaks
at the feet of a young man named Saul.
As they were stoning Stephen, he called out
“Lord Jesus, receive my spirit.”*

Reflection

In my younger years, I found it quite odd that the readings for the days after Christmas carry a somber ambiance. These were some of my thoughts back then: Should we not be joyful, after all, the Savior was born, the Prince of Peace has come? Why does the Christmas season include the martyrdom of Stephen and the murder of the holy innocents?

As I became mature in faith, I found the story of Stephen -- though intense, tragic, and filled with the people's defiance -- transcendent. Stephen was radiant with wisdom, grace and power from above. He, with steadfast faith, was unperturbed even at the sight of the heavens and maybe even with the insight that he was at death's door.

Blessed are they who put their trust in God! He immediately surrendered his fate and spirit to the God he loved.

Adding to the somber atmosphere of today's readings is Jesus' solemn and serious warning and challenge in the Gospel. It was both a warning and a challenge, yet it was reassuring. Reassuring because Jesus said ***we will be given what we need at that moment, and whoever endures until the end will be saved.*** I choose to believe and hang on to that.

I found the thread in today's readings as I noticed this little quote my friend framed and sold at her church's fundraiser. It said: FIND THE LOVE IN EACH CROSS.

Jesus, our Eternal King, came to this world, LOVE personified beyond our imagination. This is what Christmas is all about -- a love that overcame time, space, distance, divinity and humanity, and the tragedy of and triumph over death. This is

what Jesus came for: to be God's love expressed in Jesus' human life -- from his humble birth and compassionate ministry, to his ignominious death and glorious resurrection.

With God's grace, Stephen found that meaning and that gift. He believed, endured, loved, and was saved. He had that deep joy that fueled deeper love and resilience in adversities, and which made him capable of loving others.

I think that was what Saul saw that made a great impact on him.
