Today's Gospel

Lifting up his eyes to heaven, Jesus prayed saying: "I pray not only for these, but also for those who will believe in me through their word, so that they may all be one, as you, Father, are in me and I in you, that they also may be in us, that the world may believe that you sent me. And I have given them the glory you gave me, so that they may be one, as we are one, I in them and you in me, that they may be brought to perfection as one, that the world may know that you sent me, and that you loved them even as you loved me. Father, they are your gift to me. I wish that where I am they also may be with me, that they may see my glory that you gave me, because you loved me before the foundation of the world. Righteous Father, the world also does not know you, but I know you, and they know that you sent me. I made known to them your name and I will make it known, that the love with which you loved me may be in them and I in them."

JOHN 17:20-26

Reflection

This gospel passage from John is a beautiful, soulful, love song to us; a love song prayed by Jesus to his Father, and one we are to listen to and take into our being today. We are the ones who believe in Jesus through his Word. We strive for the unity that Jesus has with his Father. What does this unity look like in our lives?

There is so much discord in life today. How often do we stop and pray to God as Jesus prayed? Let us pray and may this prayer be in words, songs, or in the quiet of our inner being. 

may we be a gift that is generous of heart and gentle of soul.


Let us be a light in the darkness that, at times, permeates our world.
