

From Today's Readings

Reflection

Today we celebrate the Feast of All Souls, and we're invited to remember and pray for all the faithful departed. This includes loved ones, friends, neighbors, and even those forgotten by name, though never forgotten by God. Whenever I pray for the persons in my life who are now with God, I include any people who might not have prayers being said on their behalf. It's those persons who are not forgotten by God!

It's a day of mixed emotions — both grief and hope. Grief because death is so final for us; our loved ones are no longer with us upon this earth, and we find ourselves with an ache in our hearts and a void in our lives. Hope is our companion, and our faith assures us that death is not the end point; it is the doorway into eternal life.

This echoes in the verse from Wisdom above. While we may feel loss and sadness, from God's point of view it is the fulfillment of the promise he made to us in baptism – that nothing can separate us from God's love.

St. Paul reminds us that we can trust that we will share in the resurrection because death is not the final word as Christ rose from the dead. In the Gospel, we once again hear the echo of "I shall raise him on the last day." This is God's promise to us! Eternal life is about a relationship with the living God and a communion of our love that begins here on earth and reaches fulfillment in heaven.

We pray for our loved ones not because we doubt God's promise; we pray because love compels us. It is a way to unite us with our loved ones and give praise and lift them into God's merciful embrace.


