Reflection

What enters your mind when you make the sign of the cross? An ancient practice hearkening back to early Christianity, it is customary to begin and end

prayer or worship with this devotional tribute. Perhaps there are times the action is more rote, while there are other times it may be made with more intention. Regardless, ultimately it is an affirmation of belief in the mystery of the Trinity, and a commitment to be God's love in the world.

What images come to mind when you reflect on the Holy Trinity? Traditional images seem a bit hierarchical. While preparing PowerPoints recently for praying the rosary, I have been seeking out images or representations for the Holy Trinity to companion the recitation of the Glory Be. There are a vast number of interpretations of the Holy Trinity, some more anthropomorphic, and some more symbolic. The images that convey the unifying energy of the Trinity speak the loudest to me; that élan vital radiates love.

Father Jean Pierre Médaille SJ, founder of the Congregation of the most perfect love of God, or what became the Sisters of St. Joseph, advocated a Trinitarian spirituality that "captures the mystery of entering into loving union with God. It is relational and inclusive: a loving communion in which both divine and human are mutually engaged." (Sisters of St. Joseph of Orange, *Heritage Pilgrimage: Experiencing Our Roots, 31*) This mystical context reveals the unifying nature of the Trinity, radiating the love of God and love of each other, a total double union, the infinite reality.
