FEAST OF SAINT THOMAS, APOSTLE

Today's Gospel Acclamation

"You believe in me, Thomas, because you have seen me, says the Lord; blessed are those who have not seen, but still believe!"

JOHN 20:29

Reflection

Today is the feast of St. Thomas, the Apostle who is best remembered for doubting the Resurrection until he was allowed to touch Christ's wounds. Perhaps Thomas needed confirmation of the truth of the resurrection within the context of community. He was not with the others when they encountered the risen Jesus.

In a time of great emotional turmoil ignited by the arrest and death of Jesus, Thomas sorted through the disorienting melee of fear, anxiety, and doubt. He did not blindly accept the word of others. Thomas needed to check out the facts. Checking out the facts is a skill we all could develop in our own day.

"You believe in me, Thomas, because you have seen me, says the Lord; blessed are those who have not seen, but still believe!" alludes to all of us who have come after Thomas. I reflect on the strength of my own faith in Jesus and in God. What evidence is there in my own manner of living that I am a woman of faith? Do I believe that God is with me always? As a Spiritual Director I know that most people struggle with faith in God from time to time. Doubt or questioning are not the last word, for God never gives up on us. There is a wonderful witness in Thomas' encounter which bolsters my own ups and downs of faith.

Perhaps we might look at Thomas' most explicit statement of faith in the New Testament: "My Lord and My God!" (John 20:24-28). In so expressing his faith, Thomas gave Christians a prayer that will be said till the end of time. I have said this prayer many times over my life, and I have been bolstered with sustaining grace.

Thomas exercised the truth of his statement of faith. He followed the commission of Jesus, "to go out to all the world and tell the good news." According to some traditions, Thomas spread Jesus' teachings to India, which led to his martyrdom by decapitation. Seems like strong faith born of redeeming grace to me.

Hymn writer Henry Alford wrote the hymn, 'We Walk By Faith, And Not By Sight' in 1844, when he was around 34 years old. He was presumably inspired by the line from 2 Corinthians 5:7: 'We walk by faith, and not by sight' (Classical-Music.com). Reflecting on the words may offer insight into one's own faith journey.

WE WALK BY FAITH, AND NOT BY SIGHT

We walk by faith, and not by sight; no gracious words we hear from Him who spoke as none e'er spoke, but we believe Him near.

We may not touch His hands and side, nor follow where He trod; but in His promise we rejoice and cry, "My Lord and God!"

Help then, O Lord, our unbelief; and may our faith abound to call on You when You are near and seek where You are found.

That, when our life of faith is done, in realms of clearer light, may we behold You as You are with full and endless sight.
