Today's Verse Before the Gospel

Behold, now is a very acceptable time; behold, now is the day of salvation.

2 CORINTHIANS 6:2b

Reflection

Today we are given the ten Commandments as a source of reflection. In pondering these ancient commands, I realize that they are the minimum for living in God's ways. They are certainly worthy of my reflection. However, a fuller integration and relationship are essential to my Lenten journey of transformation.

I sense within me a deeper invitation to greater intimacy with God, that requires reflection and discernment of my own motivation under the choices I make. St. Teresa of Avila said that "one never outgrows the school of self-knowledge." Thus, coming to know my inner motivation for my words, actions, and feelings is essential. Discovering my own motivations is a tough thing, since motivations are subconscious. Only purposeful reflection and courageous honesty will reveal what I need to know about myself, so I might open to the grace of transformation.

In the Gospel for today, **Matthew 25:31-46**, the sheep are separated from the goats based on my "doing for others what I would do for Jesus." Currently, there are so many genuine needs among us, and a plethora of rationalizations about why or why not I would be concerned for other people. I am being challenged to suspend judgement and to respond with compassion, mercy, tenderness, and kindness, addressing the need before me as best I can in the moment.

God sees me and sees you, and all others as well. The thing is, God sees with compassion, not judgement. To see as God sees nudges my soul. I would love to hear God say to me, "Well done, good and faithful one who resembles God's own heart."

"For I was hungry, and you gave me food,
I was thirsty, and you gave me drink,
a stranger and you welcomed me,
naked and you clothed me,
ill and you cared for me,
in prison and you visited me."

MATTHEW 25:35-36


