CONSIDER YOUR CALLING

Consider your own calling, brothers and sisters.

Not many of you were wise by human standards,
not many were powerful,
not many were of noble birth.

Rather, God chose the foolish of the world to shame the wise,
and God chose the weak of the world to shame the strong,
and God chose the lowly and despised of the world,
those who count for nothing,
to reduce to nothing those who are something,
so that no human being might boast before God.
It is due to him that you are in Christ Jesus,

who became for us wisdom from God,

as well as righteousness, sanctification, and redemption, so that, as it is written,


Whoever boasts, should boast in the Lord.

1 CORINTHIANS 1:26-31

Context and Reflection

In this section of his letter to the Corinthians, Paul brings together ideas about call, wisdom, and weakness. He challenges his readers—and us—to "consider your own calling" and to recognize that most of those called didn't meet worldly standards of worth or value—"not many of you were wise, powerful, or of noble birth." And yet, Paul insists, God chose the weak, the lowly, those who count for nothing—earthen vessels—so that God could act in and through them, showing power through weakness.

Paul reminds us that it is an illusion to think that we save ourselves, and he challenges us to recognize that everything is a gift—all that we are and all that we have is a gift. Realizing this, we should "boast in the Lord."

filled the hungry with good things.


While he released the poor ones from affliction, and increased their families like flocks.
