# **Excerpts from Today's Gospel**

Jesus revealed himself again to his disciples at the Sea of Tiberias. Jesus said to them, "Children, have you caught anything to eat?" So Simon Peter went over and dragged the net ashore full of one hundred fifty-three large fish. Jesus came over and took the bread and gave it to them, and in like manner the fish. This was now the third time Jesus was revealed to his disciples after being raised from the dead.

JOHN 21:1, 5-6, 11, 14


#### Reflection

This is the third time Jesus has revealed himself to his disciples after his resurrection. He does so in a very familiar location as Peter and the other disciples have returned to their livelihoods as fishermen.

As a child, I often fished with my brother, Peter, in the streams and lakes near

where we grew up. We ate what we caught with mom preparing the fish in various ways. Fishing was a relaxing, quiet, and serene experience for me; though what I enjoyed most was being with my brother in such a peaceful setting. It is easy for me to picture Peter and the others casting their nets and finding the fish where Jesus said they could be caught.

This leads me to this question, where do I cast my nets? Have I heard where Jesus has asked me to go? Peter and the other disciples responded immediately when Jesus pointed out where to fish. Am I open and humble enough to heed the advice and direction from the Spirit's guidance in my own life?
