Excerpt from Today's Reading

I will make with them a covenant of peace; it shall be an everlasting covenant with them, and I will multiply them, and put my sanctuary among them forever. My dwelling shall be with them; I will be their God, and they shall be my people. Thus the nations shall know that it is I, the LORD, who make Israel holy, when my sanctuary shall be set up among them forever.

EZEKIEL 37:26-28

Reflection

This chapter in the book of Ezekiel prepares for the restoration of the Jerusalem Temple depicted in chapters 40-48. The return of the exiles coupled with confirmation of the covenant between God and God's people is imaged as

gathering around in the Temple sanctuary: "My dwelling shall be with them; I will be their God and they shall be my people." The word "dwelling" is associated with the "tent of meeting" set up during the wilderness wanderings. Even in the desert, where there was no stable gathering location, there was an experience of the "dwelling" of God. Living out of the covenant relationship with God and each other means being connected with, always belonging to each other: I will be their God, they will be my people and my dwelling shall be established among them forever.
